Our speakers will look at the current laws available here and in the US to address social and economic disadvantage and seek social justice. There will also be discussion around the intersectional issues that arise when considering socioeconomic discrimination. This will be complemented by case law updates and practical sessions on utilising current laws to bring claims under the Equality and Human Rights Act.
